# Inflation, supply chain issues pushing more families into food insecurity

Published May 1, 2023

Economic pressures caused by inflation and the overall rising cost of goods have made it more challenging for Texans to make ends meet. While most people are aware of the rising costs reflected in their grocery bills, for some families this means more than a small spending adjustment: it has pushed more households into food insecurity.



### What is food insecurity?

Food insecurity is defined as a lack of consistent access to enough nutritious food to fuel a healthy lifestyle. This can lead to difficult decisions and may have long-lasting consequences for individuals and families.

"Families facing food insecurity sometimes cope by cutting back or skipping meals altogether," said Brian Greene, president/CEO of <u>Houston</u> <u>Food Bank</u>. "They bridge the gap by making nutritional compromises. Poor nutrition is cheaper than good nutrition and that is how most of the families facing food insecurity get by. This, of course, has unfortunate consequences to health, education, and productivity."

One in eight Texans currently experience food insecurity, which amounts to around one million individuals in the 18 counties served by Houston Food Bank. Houston Food Bank has been a critical resource for the area since 1982, providing food assistance for individuals and families in times of hardship.



### Inflation and rising costs add to the challenges

While the COVID-19 pandemic may seem like a thing of the past, the effects are still being felt. Supply chain issues caused by the pandemic continue to linger, leading to increased prices and logistical challenges.

"It has affected everyone at varying levels, but for those who were already facing food insecurity, it made a tough situation dire," said Greene. "It brought a new level of demand from those the Houston Food Bank already serves, as well as from those who have never sought food assistance before. Add to that the inflation we are experiencing, and the need remains high."



Houston Food Bank recently surveyed with its partners and found that 84% have seen a notable increase in people seeking services. When asked about the primary reason more people are seeking food assistance at their location, approximately 36% cited inflation and 27% cited gas prices.

Greene noted that food insecurity isn't just about food — it's about income. Families with low incomes experience the difficulties of inflation to a greater degree because the majority of their income goes to expenses that are rising the fastest. This makes their effective inflation rate even higher. "The families we serve aren't just struggling with food costs, but also rent, utilities, transportation, health care, and more."


Two-thirds of food-insecure households have at least one working adult, but still do not have enough income to consistently meet their basic needs. "Food just tends to be what they can most readily cut back, so it is their most flexible expense," said Greene.

### How Houston Food Bank serves our community

Houston Food Bank works with a network of 1,600 community partners to provide access to food assistance as well as services and connections to programs that address the root causes of hunger and are aimed at helping families achieve long-term stability: nutrition education, health management, and help with securing assistance.



Food comes to Houston Food Bank from various sources such as donations and bulk purchasing, where it is inspected, sorted, and stored in a warehouse. The food is then distributed to community partners such as food pantries, soup kitchens, schools, multi-service centers, and other hunger relief agencies. The partners then provide food directly to individuals and families in need.

### How you can help

Because of the increased demand caused by inflation and supply chain issues, donations are more critical than ever to support Houston Food Bank, which provides access to 150 million nutritious meals each year.

"One in 8 Texans and 1 in 5 children in southeast Texas are food insecure," noted Greene. "In our service area alone, that's around one million people who are experiencing food insecurity, but we expect this number has gone up due to the pandemic and inflation."



### Here's how you can help:

**Monetary donations** – Funds are needed to help keep product in the warehouse and distribute to the community. For every dollar donated, Houston Food Bank can provide three meals, aided by volunteers and partnerships with manufacturers and distributors. You can donate <u>online</u> at <u>HoustonFoodBank.org</u> or contact the donor services team at 713-547-8623.

**Virtual food drives** – In lieu of a traditional food drive or donating purchased items, consider hosting a virtual food drive by donating funds. This helps Houston Food Bank secure product in bulk, which helps mitigate the challenges posed by inflation and supply chain issues. Alternatively, you can donate non-perishable items in the Red Barrel at your local grocery store.

**Volunteer at Houston Food Bank** — Volunteering is a great way to help Houston Food Bank. "One of our biggest needs is volunteers," said Greene. "We are simply not able to do what we do without the generosity of those who give their time." You can volunteer as an individual or get a group together for a fun way to bond and give back! It's a great opportunity for those in remote or hybrid work environments to come together and teambuild. Learn more about volunteering at Houston Food Bank.

"It's only through the support of caring people in our community that we can ensure people across southeast Texas have access to the food they need," emphasized Greene.

"We are continually touched by the kindness and generosity of our fellow Houstonians, from individuals to foundations or companies. Your donations of money, product, and volunteer hours make a big difference to our neighbors in need, especially during the holidays, a season of giving."
